

# SPORTS

All of our students have the opportunity to participate in a huge range of sports activities that are good for the mind, body and soul. From team sports to individual opportunities, we encourage everyone to participate and challenge themselves to find what's just right for them.

Participation in school sports supports the healthy growth of the heart, lungs, muscles and bones. It also improves agility, coordination and balance. Exercise also helps reduce stress levels, anxiety and behavioural problems and can have a positive impact on emotional well-being which can help improve a student's school performance.

Playing sports with classmates can motivate and help students with their confidence as they can engage in friendly competition and form new friendship groups.

We employ a dedicated Sports Coordinator to manage our overall sports programme and liaise with our local clubs and a Year 7 & 8 Sports Coordinator to focus on 7/8 sport and AIMS Games.

We uniquely sit in two sporting regions, Bay of Plenty and Thames Valley. This enables us to take part in a wide range of events including weekly leagues and one-day tournaments. There are many have-a-go opportunities as well as competitive competitions and representation. Katikati College runs school-wide competitive and participation events for athletics, swimming and cross-country as well as championships in ki-o-rahi, tennis, triathlon and squash.

Our school teams consistently produce competitive results and have many national and regional representatives in our ranks. We welcome any help with

# COASTIES

Coasties is a Level 1 & 2 NCEA subject for students at Katikati College that uses surfing as the context for learning. In this integrated course students access standards from Physical Education and Social Sciences.

Coasties provides a learning environment that enables students to make connections within and across subjects (in our case Sports Science and Geography). Coasties enables for authentic learning where the focus is on real world issues and applying ideas to the real world e.g. Plastics in our local environment (Waihi Beach), Taking action to help others (Surfing for Farmers and teaching skateboarding).

In Coasties our students will focus on the physical skills of riding waves, surf safety, fitness for surf related sports, leadership through teaching skateboarding, formation of waves, man-made waves, plastics in the ocean, sharing our waves - surf rage, surf forecasting. Coasties involves trips to Waihi Beach surfing, skateboarding at the local skate park and overnight camps to Raglan and Whangamata.

In Coasties our students help organise Surfing for Farmers at Waihi Beach. This is an initiative designed to help farmers and growers get "off farm" and out to Waihi Beach for a surf as a way of helping with mental health. This is one of many ways that our Coasties crew interact with the public and make a difference in our local community.





# ARTS

The Arts are alive at Katikati College where Music, Dance, Drama and Visual Arts are a vibrant part of school life.

There are numerous cultural and performing arts opportunities for students to actively engage with, meet new friends, refine skills and have fun! Some of the exciting activities on offer are learning musical instruments, workshops with performing and visual art professionals, competing within school and in regional and national competitions. Showcasing talent with community performances and providing learning outside the classroom with various trips.

In Drama we showcase our assessment work within our local community as well as go on trips to see live theatre locally and in Auckland. The Drama department oversees the bi-annual school production and Showquest which is an inter-school competition led by our seniors that uses Drama, Dance, Music, and theatre technologies. Our classes are able to enter the Sheilah Winn Shakespeare competition which gives students opportunities to both act and direct.

For Dance we learn a variety of styles from Salsa to contemporary and hip hop and learn how to create original pieces of Dance. We view dance performances and have a yearly showcase at the end of the year.

Art offers painting, printmaking, sculpture, photography, digital/graphic design, raranga weaving and carving. There is a yearly Senior Art Exhibition showcasing student work and the Art department leads the Showquest Toi Wearable Arts entries.

The Music department runs KKC's Got Talent and evening concerts of student work. Music students are given the opportunity to build performance skills, compose their own music and research local and international artists. We have government funded music lessons in flute, clarinet, saxophone, oboe, trumpet, trombone, horn, euphonium, guitar, bass, drums and singing. We have very qualified music teachers coming in to instruct these lessons and a private tutor for those wanting to learn keyboard or piano. There are opportunities to form bands or join the Katikati College concert band.



The Arts faculty annually alternates a School production with Showquest. Other Co Curricular opportunities include: Lip Sync, The Divas and Divos talent quest, Culture week, Jazz Band, Rock Quest, Music Tuition, Concert Band, Pasifika Group, Kapa Haka, Sheilah Winn Shakespeare Competition and Toi wearable arts.

# CULTURE

# WHĀNAU PŪMANAWA

**Whānau Pūmanawa is a whānau environment that seeks to sustain and nurture students' cultural values, tikanga and te reo Māori.**

Whānau Pūmanawa is a vertical form class incorporating Years 7-13. It exists to support the pastoral care and learning of Māori descent students or for those whānau and students who have a passion in Māoridom. We start each day with Kotahitanga (togetherness); karakia, waiata, mihihihi, pānui and kemu, kōrerorero to which provides a strong

positive and happy start to our day.

Students in Whānau Pūmanawa participate in te reo Māori classes and kapahaka. We also have the opportunity to whakawhānaungatanga and learn through various noho marae, haerenga and other experiences that strengthen their knowledge and participation in te ao Māori.

Whānau Pūmanawa is supported by regular whānau hui and attending and supporting various kaupapa Māori with our communities.



# AIGA

**Malo e lelei, Talofa lava, Ni sa bula vinaka, Malo ni. Aiga is a 'home away from home' for students of Pacific Island descent.**

Aiga is a vertical form class for Year 11, 12 and 13 students. Students are academically mentored and cared for by Mrs Vetekina Pekipaki.

Cultural practices such as Lotu/prayer to begin the day are incorporated into the daily routine. The Aiga students lead the Pasifika activities in the school for example Pasifika Group performances and celebrations for Pacific Language weeks. Students are offered the opportunity to opt into the class when they finish Year 10

or when they arrive from other schools. Regular Po Talanoa are held with families to share what is happening at school and build learning partnerships with the community.

Students say they enjoy being part of Aiga because they can learn about different cultures and languages, be a part of a supportive Polynesian family, learn new words and eat different types of Polynesian foods! "We get to experience other cultures, speak in our own languages and take part in Pasifika performances."

Students from Katikati College can compete at events such as the Pasifika Speech Competition, Pasifika in the Bay, Paparazzi Short Film Competition, Fiefia Night and many more Pasifika related events.



# INNOVATIVE HORTICULTURE

**Horticulture at Katikati College is a modular, flexible and future-focused programme of learning that can really take students places in the many career paths available in this amazingly diverse, growing industry, or in other industries where innovation is key.**

Students choose a pathway relevant to them personally, selecting topics from Science, Agribusiness, Marketing, Digital Technology, Sustainability as well as Plant Management, combining academic

knowledge and practical skills. Significant real life learning takes place on visits to orchards, nurseries and other horticultural ventures.

Career opportunities in horticulture are almost endless. Students could end up flying the drones which monitor crops, inventing robotic picking and packing machines, advising growers on how to achieve better results, working hands on outdoors picking, pruning and managing orchards, monitoring fruit quality in laboratories and packhouses, managing biosecurity or breeding new plant varieties, to give just a few examples.

Local industry supports students leaving Katikati College to enter a career in horticulture with generous scholarships and work experience.

# TECHNOLOGY

**The Technology Faculty is a vibrant and creative part of Katikati College. Students are taught many skills and techniques which they can then apply to projects. The range of outcomes is considerable. The faculty has adopted CNC technologies including 3D printing, vinyl cutting, CNC routing and CNC laser.**

Subjects taught are Digital Technology, DVC, Food and Hospitality, Fabric Technology, Engineering and Carpentry. As we move forward in education, we are reminded that the soft skills of cooperation, commitment, innovation, and communication are of increasing importance as our students strive to find their place in the world.

# SCIENCE

**It is essential that all students receive a solid grounding in current scientific understandings, values and skills for them to function in our modern world that is increasingly shaped by the application of Science to nearly every aspect of daily life.**

Our Year 7 and 8 students learn Science in fully equipped labs with specialist Science teachers. Year 9 - 11 students learn how Science ideas are communicated and how to make links between knowledge, decisions and actions. Year 12 and 13 students branch out into Biology, Chemistry, Physics and Earth and Space science.

# MANAAKITANGA

**At Katikati College, we pride ourselves on the Manaakitanga that we provide for our students through our pastoral care team.**

We have year level Deans who work with our students on maintaining their wellbeing and who provide academic mentoring.

Our Poumatua is a specific position that we have to better support our Māori students. We also have a full time guidance counsellor on staff.

A health nurse is based on site four days a week and the local medical centre runs a surgery at school once a week. This means that our students are able to access free health care through the College.

Our Year 7 students are involved in a peer support programme run by the Year 13 students. This enables the new cohort to feel more comfortable in transitioning into our school.

Katikati College has an extensive Outdoor Education programme available to our senior students across Levels 1, 2 and 3. Throughout the year long course, you will be actively involved in various activities that allow you to experience what our local environment has to offer.

From walking in the beautiful Kaimai ranges, rafting down the Kaituna River, admiring the natural cave landscape at Waitomo and kayaking in the Tauranga Moana. Outdoor education allows students to have authentic learning where we can apply theory to real world experiences.




“ Katikati College has helped shape me into a leader by giving me the opportunity to stand up and speak up about the things and change I would like to see.


